## Coughs and Sneezes ... Email from earlier this week:

Please remember to leave a message on the absence line to say that your child is not coming into school and why.

We have had two children who have been diagnosed with Scarlet Fever – usually a mild illness, but often in need of antibiotics. If you are in any doubt about your child's symptoms, please seek medical advice.
