## **Local History Week**

We have had a fantastic Local History Week with every year group focusing on different aspects of our rich, local past.

In Nursery, the children have really enjoyed show and tell - sharing old toys and stories from parents and grandparents.

In Reception, the children visited St Paul's Church and then compared the old Ongar House with the present school building.

Year 1, also visited the church and handled old artefacts. They have explored Ongar Hill House and compared our school to Victorian schools.

Year 2, have been way back to prehistoric times learning about St Anne's Hill. They have studied maps to see any changes, looked at an Iron Age fort and handled some very old artefacts.

Brooklands race track has been investigated by Year 3. They learned about the development of the motor car, made a race track and developed a board game. Year 4, studied Hampton Court, locating it on maps and had a virtual tour. They had great fun asking enquiring questions and being creative when handling and wearing Tudor artefacts. They have investigated the importance of paintings and created their own royal portraits.

Year 5 have been delving into Chertsey Abbey. They have reproduced a medieval map and compared it to more recent maps noticing any changes. They have handled and sketched 700-year old tiles, found out about the life of a monk and investigated the chronology of the Abbey - discovering why it is no longer there. The M25 has been a focus for Year 6. They have studied a range of maps from different times to note similarities and differences.

It has been great to see the children get excited, curious and interested in our local history. May be some of you might be able to follow up the children's learning with some days out during half term.
