Tuesday 16th April- Children return to school to begin the summer term.

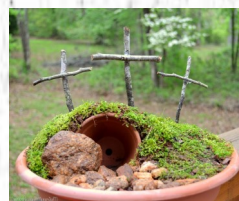


RE
