YEAR 1 Curriculum Overview Summer 2024



Reminders:

Children should be reading their reading book 5 times a week. Please record and leave a comment in their Reading Record book. They are welcome to read other books as well but their school book needs to be read 5 times a week.

Home Learning will support classroom learning and will be set every Friday to be completed by the following Tuesday. Please support your child but encourage them to be as independent as possible.

Swimming is on a Wednesday morning and PE is on a Thursday. Please make sure your child has a full, named PE kit in school and bring in a swimming kit each Wednesday. Children with pierced ears should not wear earrings on these days.

Our school trip will be on Tuesday 23rd April and we will be going to The Lookout Discovery Centre in Bracknell. This will support the children's learning in Science.

Forest School will take place again after the May half term. It will take place on Fridays. Further information will be sent out nearer the time.

This Term's Theme:

London- Exploring what it is like now and its history

Science:

We will be focusing this term on plants as well as continuing to investigate seasonal change. Children will plant runner beans and make observations about their growth. They will explore what wild plants are around the school grounds and what plants need in order to grow.

English:

- Discussing new word meanings and linking new meanings to those they already know
- Continuing to develop and apply phonic knowledge to help with spelling and reading

- Composing sentences orally before writing them
- Spell the 100 high-frequency words
- Reading their own writing back to an adult confidently
- Introduction of question marks and exclamation marks
- · Separation of words with spaces
- Joining words and joining clauses using 'and' or 'but'
- Know when to use a capital letter and when to use lower case
- **Key texts:** The Naughty Bus, Iggy Peck Architect, Billy and the Beast

Maths:

- Number and place value to 100

- Identifying missing numbers
- Odd and even numbers
- Counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s
- Grouping and sharing

- Fractions and proportion (1/2, 1/4 and 1/3)
- Time measurement (1/2 and 1/4 hour)

- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving +, -, and =
- Resources used: bead strings, 100-square, number lines
- Problem solving revisiting existing number facts, deriving subtraction facts and revising pairs of numbers

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Music

Use voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes Play tuned and untuned instruments musically experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the inter-related dimensions of music

Children will learn and sing a range of traditional songs. They will use the Charanga programme to explore different musical dynamics and use a range of percussion instruments to improvise musically.

Design & Technology

Evaluate their products against a range of criteria

Children will design and make a small scale wheeled vehicle to transport a toy figure. They will choose the most appropriate tools and materials from a given range. They will learn about how to evaluate their own work once complete.

Geography

Children will develop their knowledge about the United Kingdom. They will explore the features of London and compare these to their local area.

RE

Why do Christians call God the Creator? Why should we look after our world?

Children will explore the story of Creation. They will wonder how Christians can share God's creation and respond to the world around them in a way that shows awe, sensitivity and gratitude.

History

Knowledge of a significant historical figure and historical events

Children will explore how London has changed throughout history. They will explore historical events such as The Great Fire of London, The Blitz and The Gunpowder plot.

They will also look at The Royal Family.

Art & Design

Use materials creatively

Continue learning about great artists

Use a range of materials to share upon own ideas Share and discuss own work

Pencil sketches and paintings

Children will use their existing knowledge of line, shape and colour in art so that they may create their own masterpieces. We will be drawing and painting different animals and we will do a portrait of the new King.

Computing

Use word processor

Enter, add and remove text on a computer

Explore the toolbar

Use programming blocks to use, modify and create programmes.

Children will develop their understanding of the various aspects of using a computer to create and manipulate text. They will become more familiar with using a keyboard and mouse to enter and remove text. Children will be introduced to on-screen

programming through using Scratch Jr and the early stages of algorithms.
