Last week, we tested different materials for their properties. This week, we tested for another property – solubility. Which materials would dissolve in water and what does dissolve mean?

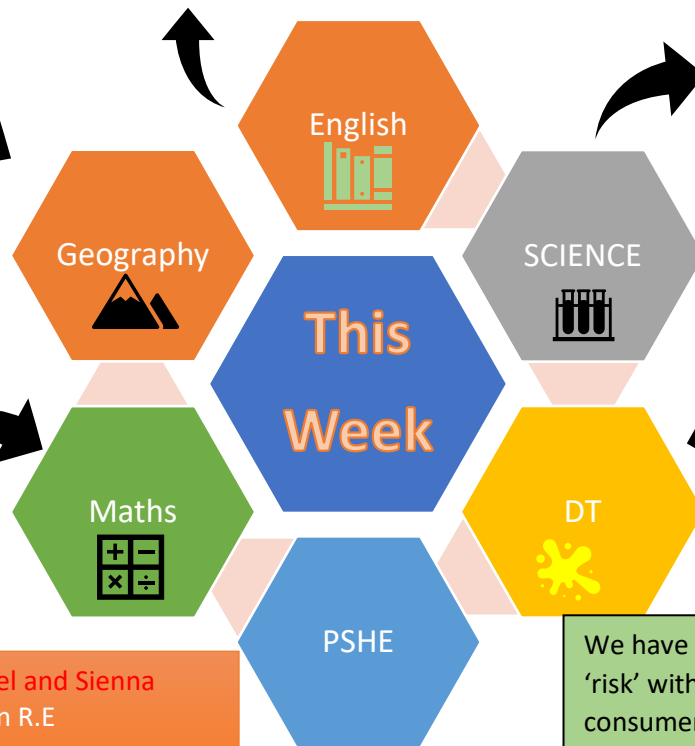
We followed up our learning about rivers from last week. We learned about the journey of a river. We drew a river from its source to the mouth, learned about different physical and human features and labelled our diagram.
