Mini Marathon

What an amazing time we had this week running our very own mini marathon to raise money for Brain Tumour Research. On Monday all of the children went out together, and siblings ran the first lap together in their house teams with Mrs Staunton and Miss Minto setting the pace. After that children were free to run or walk as many laps as they wanted in their allocated time. Our highest lap numbers were: Chestnuts - Abigail, 6 laps, Yr 1 - Blake, 7 laps, Yr 2 - Verity, 7 laps, Yr 3 - Karo, 8 laps, Yr 4 - Zayd, 10 laps, Yr 5 - Noah, 9 laps, Yr 6 - Henry & Octavia, 9 laps.

Our house results were:

- 1st - Runnymede - 246 laps
- 2nd - Brooklands - 238 laps
- 3rd - Painshill - 226 laps
- 4th - Wisley - 220 laps

That's a grand total of 930 laps with 371km distance covered in total with everyone running for 20 mins. However, the main aim of the event was to come together in sport as a whole school, raise awareness and raise money, and everyone did that regardless of how far or how fast they ran.

We raised over £1,500!

Nursery mini marathons took place throughout the week and it was lovely to see our youngest children supported by our Ambassadors and House Captains. We will now leave the real marathon running to Miss Hale at the weekend. GOOD LUCK!!
