

YEAR 3 WEEKLY LEARNING

Summer Term

English

This week, the children explored how to use conditional sentences to give warnings using an if/then structure. They learned that these sentences help explain what might happen as a result of certain actions. The class discussed examples such as "If you eat too many sweets, then you might get a toothache" and "If you don't do your homework, then you might fall behind in your learning." To apply their understanding, the children created their own "Warning!" posters, where they chose a situation (like eating too many sweets or not completing homework) and wrote clear conditional sentences to warn others. This activity helped them practise sentence structure while thinking carefully about consequences.

Maths

This week in Maths, the children consolidated their understanding of notes and coins from previous years, building confidence in recognising and using different forms of money. They practised writing amounts using £ and p notation and learned to read monetary values correctly, such as saying "5 pounds and 10 pence." The children also developed a deeper understanding of place value by comparing different amounts of money, using the symbols $<$, $>$ and $=$ to show whether values are less than, greater than, or equal to each other.
