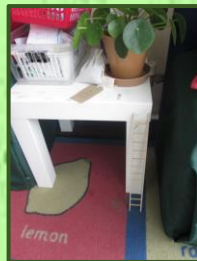
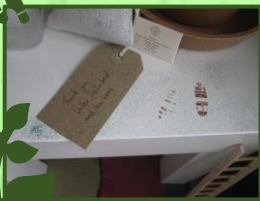


Just like that May half term has arrived!
