Maths

We have completed our unit on negative numbers and have now moved on to learning about converting units of measure. The children have been exploring how to convert between different units, including kilograms and grams, litres and millilitres, metres and millimetres, and kilometres and metres.

This is a challenging topic as it requires the children to understand the relationships between different units and apply their multiplication and division knowledge accurately. At times, the children have found some of the conversions tricky, particularly when deciding whether to multiply or divide, but they have shown great perseverance and are giving every task a good try.

As part of the project, the children will learn how to make pastry from scratch, developing important cooking and food preparation skills along the way.
