They have several magnificent trees on the school grounds. But during the last lockdown they lost their largest Cedar tree, that had stood there for decades.

So today I was able to donate 2 Oak saplings for them to plant on the school grounds. And eventually, they will have 2 more magnificent trees to provide shade and shelter to generations of children for years to come.'
