


YEAR 5 LEARNING LETTER 25.3.22



We have been finishing the story of the Sleeper and the Spindle. We inferred about the characters' thoughts and feeling at a dramatic part of the story, thought about the twists and turns in the story and how it plays with our expectations of traditional stories. We have used formal language to write a letter from the Queen to her fiancé and started to think about writing a new story for these characters.



We have been looking at data again and at graphing. This time we have been investigating whether a relationship exists between life expectancy of animals and the length of gestation. What do you think?



In Art, following our exploration of colour we have been sketching a landscape and considering different techniques for creating texture. We have also cooked our pasties. We weighed ingredients, cut vegetables, made pastry and put together the pasty. We will taste them next week.



Maps has been the focus this week. We have drawn maps identifying human and physical features in a National Park. After we tried a difficult task of interpreting a O.S map and then sketching a view that we might see from a place on the map.
